






Data-limited stocks

- WP Council formed the Fishery Data
 Collection and Research Committee
- Goal: improve data limited situation and coordinate regional research
 - FDCRC Regional Strategic Plan
- 2015 RFPs (i.e. FIS/FIN, SK) provided a jumpstart to the process
- NEED: stable source of funding (Congressional line item or Council base funds)
- Similar to the FIN line item from NMFS (but not through WPacFIN!)

















Pelagic/International Fisheries Management

- 1. US tuna fisheries are losing in the Pacific
 - Lower bigeye quotas for Hawaii longline fishery, while PS bigeye catches rise
 - Removal of important Kiribati waters for US distant water purse seine fleet
 - Expansion of Pacific Remote Island Marine National Monument
 - US vessels are being outcompeted by less monitored, subsidized foreign fleets
- 2. NMFS is failing to lead in the WCPFC
 - repeated requests from Council for NMFS to introduce spatial management measures to address bigeye overfishing
 - Council is holding workshops to address major Intl management issues
- 3. Divergent reference points for stocks, e.g. FEP reference points versus RFMOs reference points, which takes precedence?















Evaluating Hawaii Longline Catch Shares

- The Hawaii longline is subject to internationally established quotas in the WCPO and EPO
- More longline vessels have entered the Hawaii fishery in recent years, and vessels are deploying more gear (Race to the fish?)
- The Council will be working with the Hawaii longline industry and others to consider fishery rationalization options.
 - This initiative will require funding and NMFS support















WP Council 5-Yr Program Priorities

- 1) Conduct reviews of Fishery Ecosystem Plans (FEPs)
- 2) Integrate ecosystem information into the FEPs
- 3) Support monitoring, data collection and research
- 4) Support capacity building and fishery development
- 5) Support US fisheries on the international level related to highly migratory species (HMS) management, trade and compliance
